After settling in your room, depart with your group to walk just next door over to the Visitor Center. There you will be given a length of stay pass for admission into Colonial Williamsburg. DAY 6 | Colonial Williamsburg

After your included breakfast, step out of the door of your hotel and into history. Colonial Williamsburg is the place where you can truly experience the dawn of America. Step back in time and meet the people who made America - sing with them, dance with them, eat with them, and have fun with them. The 18th century city of Colonial Williamsburg is our nation's largest Living History Museum, a virtual "Disneyland" for folks interested in history! Williamsburg was the capital of Virginia and the largest, most prosperous American colony. Men and women from all walks of life strolled these streets, and you'll following in their footsteps. Explore dozens of original buildings, homes, and shops reconstructed on 301 acres - most on their original foundations. Rare animal breeds, historic trades, and lovingly restored gardens add layers of authenticity to the Colonial Williamsburg experience. You'll feel as if you've traveled back in time! At the end of the day, meet your group at Christina Campbells Tavern for dinner and period musical entertainment. The group will then take the shuttle back to the hotel for the rest of the evening. If you like, you can continue to walk the street of Williamsburg after dinner and immerse yourself in a different time! Shuttles run until 9:00 PM.
